Subsequent interventions focused on emphasizing appropriate positioning of agriculture and food security in climate change negotiations and stressed the need to expedite guidance or finance to the developing country parties

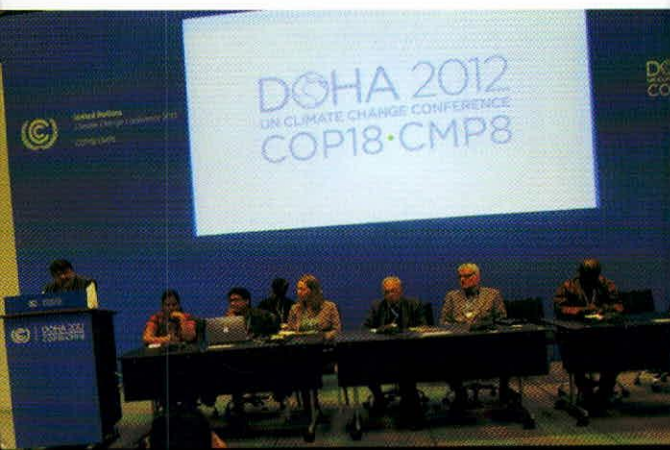

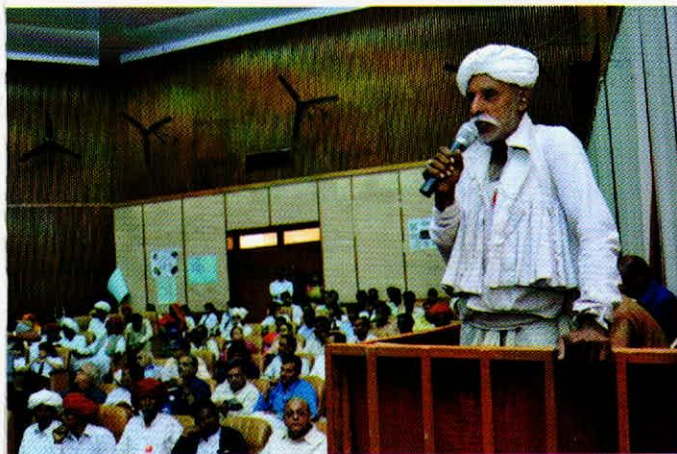

## Major areas

- Highlighting Traditional Resilience to Climate Change
- Engaging with Public Actors and Policymakers
- Compilation of Analyses and Critiques of Policies on Climate Change
- Sensitising Media
- Interventions at UNFCCC and its preparatory forums i.e. the COPs.

## Interventions

- Consultations on agriculture and food security issues in the National and State Action Plans on Climate Change (NAPCC and SAPCCs) – to bring to light the perfunctory priority given to agriculture in climate change policies in India, along with discussions on water, forest, and even the energy sectors.
- Public Hearings on Impact of Climate Change – including a national and a series of hearings in different agro-climatic zones, to bring forward evidence in the form of testimonies of people to influence the decision makers on the urgency of taking serious, effective and meaningful action.



- Consultations and Workshops on Climate Change - These were conducted to draw attention of policy makers and public actors on priority areas for policy and action on climate change.

Recently, a PreCOP Consultation on “Priorities and Expectations from COP 19” was organized in New Delhi. The event hosted Deputy Minister of Environment from Poland, Mrs. Beata Jacewska, along with representatives from key actors including China, Mexico, Australia and Norway
